The California Department of Justice, Office of the Attorney General, Criminal Division, Appeals, Writs and Trials Section ("Sac-AWT") in Sacramento, is currently recruiting students for its 2004 Summer Honors Program. Deputy Attorneys General in AWT represent the People of California in post-conviction proceedings. Students will draft Respondent's Briefs that are filed in the California Courts of Appeal for the Third and Fifth Appellate Districts in appeals from felony convictions. This involves reviewing the record on appeal, conducting research, analyzing legal issues, and developing arguments. The student team is supervised by a deputy, and all student briefs are reviewed and critiqued. Students will manage their own caseload. Appeals involve issues of criminal law and procedure, including constitutional, evidentiary, and instructional issues. Students who are certified by the California State Bar may have the opportunity to argue before the California Court of Appeal.

WHO MAY APPLY:

For Summer 2004 Summer Honors Program: 2Ls may apply who have had criminal law, evidence, criminal procedure and constitutional law. For Spring 2004 Clinical program: 2Ls or 3Ls may apply who have requisite coursework completed. Applicants for the Sac-AWT program must have excellent writing, research, and analytical skills.
