SARUM PRIMER PRAYER INSPIRES COMPOSER

At a previous Tuesday rehearsal while we sang Jackson Berkey's "God Be In My Head," I recalled that the text of the piece is a prayer from the Anglican Church's *Sarum Primer* of 1558. I also remembered how much I liked this prayer when I first came across it.

The Sarum Chant was the text and music for the church rite at Salisbury, England, and had parallels to (indeed,



ACDA California Coastal Regional Honor Choir to perform

The Sunday before the week of Thanksgiving, November 23, the ACDA California Coastal Regional Honor Choir performs at 2 p.m. at the Henry J. Mello Center for the Performing Arts in Watsonville. The performance is free and first-come-first-served seating. Families of choir members receive seating priority.

I learned of this concert from my mandolin instructor and former Cabrillo Symphonic Chorus piano accompanist, Irene Herrmann. She will be the piano accompanist at this concert. Willow Manspeaker, assistant for the Cabrillo Youth Chorus, also has the following information about the choir:

The group performing at the Mello Center is the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA) California Coastal Regional Honor Choir and is made up of high school students who audition for the honor of being in it. The students represent the coastal region of California from the Oregon border to as far south as Santa Maria.

Salisbury was built in the town of Old Sarum but a new one was built in the 13th century in the nearby New Town of Salisbury. (Old Sarum is now a Norman ruin.)

Contemporary travelers to Salisbury can visit the beautiful old "new" cathedral and, if they're there at the right
