Those of you not planning to attend the ACDA California Coastal Regional Honor Choir concert may be interested in learning to sing in Scottish-Gaelic. Rich Hill, award-winning Gaelic singer and founder of the Slighe nan Galdheal Society (say that 3 times, really fast), will lead two singing workshops—Solo Gaelic Singing from 2 to 3:30 and Scottish-Gaelic Choral Repertoire from 3:30 to 5—on Sunday, November 23, in a series of Scottish-Gaelic workshops that include ones on learning to speak the language, play Scottish fiddle, and dance Cape Breton step-dance.
