Suggestions

While singing "Chichester Psalms," we need to be aware of our body language at measure 10 when we all jump up to an F. It looks like we've all just been slapped! We need to use our voices, not our heads. Also, I was recently going over the score with my music teacher, and he commented, "When you are singing in Hebrew, go quickly to the vowel." I'm pondering this.

We're singing "Unto Us a Son is Born" again this year as part of the community sing. Be aware that the correct pronunciation for *grievously* is "greevuss-ly," *not* "gree-vee-uss-ly." In the past, I've heard that extra, incorrect syllable. Think of words with similar endings to *grievous*, such as *jealous*, *lustrous*, *fabulous*.
